### **Collect**

God of compassion, whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, shared the life of a home in Nazareth, and on the cross drew the whole human family to himself: strengthen us in our daily living that in joy and in sorrow we may know the power of your presence to bind together and to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

# First Reading Exodus 2.1-10

Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him. The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds

and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. 'This must be one of the Hebrews' children,' she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?' Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.' So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages.' So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, 'because', she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'

## Second Reading 2 Corinthians 1.3-7

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation, who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God. For just as the sufferings of Christ are abundant for us, so also our consolation is abundant through Christ. If we are being afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation; if we are being consoled, it is for your consolation, which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we are also suffering. Our hope for you is unshaken; for we know that as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our consolation.

# Gospel Reading Luke 2.33-35

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed-and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

# Sermon by The Revd Nichola Winter Third Sunday of Lent at Aldringham 3<sup>rd</sup> March

I have an admission to make. I'm not a big fan of housework but despite my dislike of mops, buckets and dusters, even I find that at this time of year my thoughts turn to spring cleaning - cleansing and making ready for better weather.

In the gospel today we hear the story often referred to as 'the cleansing of the temple.' Why is Jesus so angry about what he finds going on? We're told that Jesus doesn't just tell the moneychangers and people selling animals to get out – he makes a whip of cords and drives them out; then he pours out the bags of coins and throws over the tables. We can picture the scene – an angry young man causing a great deal of disruption. And indeed, this scene has been painted many times by artists throughout the ages.

Needless to say Jesus' action shocks the Jews – they demand to know by what right he takes it upon himself to cause such an upset. Just who does he think he is? And Jesus gives them an ambiguous reply – 'destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up.' Not for the only time he speaks in riddles and confounds the Jews – they think he is referring to the temple of brick and stones, but no, Jesus is referring to himself – the temple of his body. A reference to his death and then resurrection on the third day...

The cleansing of the temple. A casting out of all that is wicked and corrupt. The temple authorities have decreed that certain animals have to be bought in order to be sacrificed, money has to be offered in the form of temple coinage – it can be changed on the premises, no doubt at some extortionate rate of exchange. Corrupt practices have been allowed to take hold; they distort the nature of the true worship of God. Jesus sees that the temple, a place used for the worship of the Father – his Father – has become a sink of iniquity, and his anger boils over and he determines to be rid of all that hinders true worship, true prayer and true being with God.

A cleansing. A spring-cleaning – and perhaps that is what we all need at this time of the year - a driving out of all the accumulated debris, dust and rubbish that prevents us from enjoying a loving relationship with our Father in heaven. During this season of Lent, as we contemplate the spring cleaning at home, we also have an opportunity to examine our own

relationship with God, our spiritual life. It may be a time to re-examine and throw out the things that have been preventing us from enjoying the close relationship that God longs for us to have with him. A kind of spiritual spring clean.

Jesus calls each one of us to carry out that spiritual spring clean so that we can develop our right relationship with God. And in that process of overhauling our lives we may be tempted to adopt a kind of 'back to basics approach' — what are the rules we try to obey? Jesus sums it up neatly: 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.'

So in Lent we have the opportunity to think about what these laws mean in our lives. If we are thorough in our spring cleaning we can throw out the rubbish, open our hearts and minds to the love of God and invite the fresh air, the Holy Spirit, to fill our lives. Amen.
